

## Sunday School Lesson 10 (Primarys)

Title: Haman Pouts

Scripture: Esther 5:9-14

Lesson Objective: The child will learn that pride is never satisfied through the example of Haman.

Materials needed: Proverbs 16:18 verse visual  
“Itis” object lesson

1. Learn the verse
2. Have prayer time
3. Sing “Oh, be careful”
4. Begin Bible Lesson
5. Object Lesson

Introduction: Introduce the story by comparing and contrasting Esther’s brave humility and Haman’s cowardly pride. Esther was brave enough to appear before King Ahasuerus with a humble attitude, thus gaining the King’s favor. Haman was such a proud coward that he in the midst of all his honor, riches, and bragging to others all about it, was not satisfied because one poor Jew, Mordecai, would not bow to him.

Progression of events outline:

1. Haman leaves the palace happy until he sees Mordecai who will not show respect to him.
2. Haman goes home and tells his family and friends of all his riches, promotions, advancements, and invitations to Esther’s banquets. (climax)
3. Haman complains that he is not happy as long as he sees Mordecai sitting at the King’s gate.
4. Haman’s wife and friends convince him to build a gallows for Mordecai so that he can go to the banquet and have a good time.

Conclusion: Start the “Itis” object lesson as a conclusion to the lesson.
